

2026 Smoke- and Vape-Free Scholars Initiative



The Smoke- and Vape-Free Scholars Initiative

- Funded awards support mentorship and training activities that include enabling undergraduate, post-bac and master's-level students from CSU/CCCs to conduct tobaccorelated research projects in a mentor's laboratory or team, while also engaging in local tobacco control activities and participating in other educational activities.
- The Initiative aims to stimulate student enthusiasm for tobacco-related research and foster engagement and persistence of the next generation of researchers that represent the different tobacco priority populations.



Tobacco Priority Populations

- disproportionately targeted by the tobacco industry,
- use tobacco at higher-thanaverage rates,
- experience greater exposure to secondhand or thirdhand smoke and vape aerosol, or
- have higher rates of tobaccorelated disease.





Applicants will propose a theme and SVFSI research experiences relevant to tobacco control issues for one or more tobacco priority populations

Current TRDRP research priorities:

- Research in Support of the California Endgame Initiative;
- Social and Behavioral Prevention and Treatment;
- State and Local Tobacco Policy Research;
- Tobacco-Related Diseases;
- Environmental Exposure and Toxicology; and
- Neuroscience of Nicotine Addiction and Treatment.

SFVSI Program Award Partnership Considerations

- The CSU/CCC* Institution will be officially responsible for submitting grant materials
- SVFSI Program Awards are one project with two budgets:
 - One budget will be prepared by, and awarded to, the CSU/CCC Co-PI's institution
 - A second budget will be prepared by, and awarded to, the Research Co-PI's Institution.
 - When preparing your Full Application budget(s), please be mindful of the overall caps on the Administrative, Scholar and Mentor budget categories (*Award Table, p.10*)
- Subcontracts are allowed for each Co-PI institution and must be fully justified.
- All out-of-state subcontracts and collaborations must be well-justified. Please note that funding for out-of-state expenses are extremely limited and TRDRP does not encourage such expenses.

Peer Review of Applications: Scoring Rating scale consistent with the 1-9 NIH scale

SCORE	DESCRIPTOR	Strengths/Weaknesses	
1	Exceptional	Extremely strong with essentially no weaknesses	
2	Outstanding	Extremely strong with negligible weaknesses	
3	Excellent	Very strong with only some minor weaknesses	
4	Very Good	Strong but with numerous minor weaknesses	
5	Good	Strong with at least one moderate weakness	
6	Satisfactory	Some strengths but also some moderate weaknesses	
7	Fair	Some strengths but with at least one major weakness	
8	Marginal	A few strengths and a few major weaknesses	
9	Poor	Very few strengths and a few major weaknesses	



SVFSI Program Award Peer Review Scoring Criteria

Each application is scored on these three criteria:

Criteria Set-1: Impact (30% scoring weight)

- Impact on Research Pipeline
- Impact on Scholars

Criteria Set-2: Program Quality (50% scoring weight)

- Scholar Recruitment Plan
- Tobacco Control/Advocacy Projects & Educational Programming
- Mentoring Plan
- Administration & Evaluation Collaboration, Communication Plans

Criteria Set-3: Feasibility (20% scoring weight)

- Team/Institution Qualifications
- Student Access
- Letters of Support


Resubmissions

- An SVFSI resubmission is an unfunded SVFSI application that was submitted to TRDRP as a new application in the 2023 (T33...) cycle and is resubmitted under the current 2026 Call for Applications (T36...).
- Resubmitted applications are allowed to include a 2-page resubmission statement immediately preceding the SVFSI Program Plan.
